

What awaits you at the Port of Astoria?



As you approach the Port of Astoria dock you will see a tented area with 20-30 market vendors featuring regional arts and crafts. Local bands send sweet sounds into the air. Our assembly of blue-coated cruise host volunteers number 140 strong. These dedicated individuals are on hand for each cruise ship landing to ensure that you have a memorable time in Clatsop County.



At the end of tented area you may purchase all day shuttle passes. Destination : the historic Liberty Theater in downtown Astoria. The shuttle busses run throughout the day in 15 minute intervals. The bus ride is generally a 15 minute ride.



Downtown Astoria offers a variety of quality dining experiences, unique shops, and historic storefronts. Nearby Warrenton, with both river and ocean frontage, is home to Fort Stevens State Park and the Lewis and Clark National Historical Park.



The beach towns of Seaside and Cannon Beach each have their own flavor. Seaside offers much in the way of family fun and a wide sandy beach, plus the Seaside Factory Outlet Center. Cannon Beach is best known for its galleries and boutique shops.



On the return trip, may we suggest you enjoy a ride on the Astoria Riverfront Trolley? Catch it along the waterfront and it will drop you off just 500 yards from the dock for embarkation.


A Sampling of Sights, Museums & Activities
